Student Enrollment

2003-2004:

158 students were enrolled in the Neighborhood Charter School for its second year of operation in the following grade level configuration –
3 Kindergarten classes of 15 children, 3 First grade classes of 20 children, 1 Second grade class of 20 children, 1 Third grade class of 20 children, and 1 fourth grade class of 20 children

The student body for this year is most diverse. 27% of our students are in the free and reduced lunch program. 30% of our children live in single parent homes. The racial makeup of the students is -

47% - Black, 39% - Caucasian, 11% - Multi-racial, 3% - Hispanic, 1% other

2004-2005:

Neighborhood Charter School will add two additional second grade classes and a fifth grade for the 2004-2005 school year. This will increase the student body by 60 students. There are waiting lists at kindergarten, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th grades. **94%** of the 2002-2003 student body re-enrolled for the 2003-2004 school year.

Student Attendance: NCS student average daily attendance for the year was **94.1%**.

Staff Attendance: NCS staff average daily attendance for the year was **97%**.
