**Plural**

When you are talking about more than one thing, the word for “The” word “The” is LOS for masculine nouns and Las for feminine nouns:

Singular	Plural
El gato	Los gatos
La gata	Las gatas

To make nouns plural, you usually add “S” to those ending in a vowel, and “ES” to those ending in a consonant.

Singular	Plural
El perro (The dog)	Los perros (more than one dog)
El pez (The fish)	Los peces ( more than one fish)

A- E- I – O- U \_\_\_ ADD “S”

L- Z- ETC. \_\_\_\_\_ ADD “ES”

Date in Spanish The Spanish way is to write the day + month + year. This is different from the American way (month + day + year). **el 29 de febrero de 1996,**
