Nouns

In Spanish all nouns are either masculine or feminine. The word you use for “THE” is El before a masculine noun and La before a feminine noun:

Ej: El gato The Cat. (masculine)

La mesa The table. (femenine)

Nouns which describe what people are or what they do usually have a masculine and a feminine form:

La Maestra ____ The teacher (femenine)

El Maestro ____ The teacher(masculine)

El amigo ____ The friend(masculine)

La amiga ____ The friend (femenine)

Plural

When you are talking about more than one thing, the word for “The” word “The” is LOS for masculine nouns and Las for feminine nouns:

Singular Plural

El Amigo Los amigos

La amiga Las amigas

To make nouns plural, you usually add “S” to those ending in a vowel, and “ES” to those ending in a consonant.

Singular Plural

El libro(The book) Los Libros

El amigo(the friend) Los amigos

El papel (The paper) Los papeles

La mesa (the table) Las mesas

La estación (The station) Las estaciones

A-E-I-O-U ADD “S”

L- S-ETC ADD “ES”
